## **Learning Objectives:**

Participants learn strategies to create respect, cooperation, and responsibility in their schools. Respect Agreements provide positive behavioral support for students and teachers while clarifying norms and expectations. Assertive speaking and active listening skills improve constructive communication. A peacemaking strategy addresses hurts/violations and a problem-solving strategy addresses disagreements; both grounded in the researched theory and evidenced based best practices of Conflict Resolution Education, Peacemaking, and Restorative Justice.

## **Learning Strategies:**

**Include case studies, stories, demonstrations, mini-lectures, discussion, and non-threatening small group practice.**

**Instructors and Guests:** Dr Ron Claassen, co-author with Roxanne Claassen of *Discipline That Restores*, is the lead instructor. Ron developed the first Victim Offender Reconciliation Program in California, is an international leader in Restorative Justice, and an experienced national and international trainer.

Dr Dalton Reimer, faculty emeritus at Fresno Pacific University, is a recognized storyteller and scholar with special emphasis on conflict in the book of Genesis. Roxanne Claassen is a retired eighth grade teacher at Raisin City School where she introduced and refined the practices of *Discipline That Restores* and Peer Mediation over nearly 20 years.

Ed Barton is a retired counselor, teacher and coordinator of peer mediation at Roosevelt High School.

Ryan Wood is the Principal at Immanuel High School. Gary Gleason is a teacher at Alta Sierra Intermediate in Clovis.
